#### **Special Note to Parents:**

The end of the semester, and exam week in particular, is a period of great stress for students. Certainly, many students feel some anxiety as they prep for exams and await the results of their efforts. A normal amount of stress can serve to motivate a student to buckle down and concentrate on her studies. For other students, though, the stress builds to unhealthy levels as they feel completely overwhelmed, unable to concentrate, & unable to eat properly. Such stress may also interrupt her sleeping pattern and cause her to become highly emotional. In a very few cases, the distress a student feels can spiral from anxiety into depression. As a concerned parent, I am sure that you want not only to stay on top of your daughter's academic performance, but also to monitor her emotional state. If you see signs of stress or anxiety, reassure her of your support by lending a sympathetic ear and a shoulder to lean on. If she appears especially distressed, please do not hesitate to contact her school counselor to discuss your concerns. Preston's Counseling Department faculty is experienced in helping our students deal with their emotional issues, especially at exam time. When anxieties intensify into depression or a student threatens self-harm, our counselors can help the family find outside psychological, psychiatric or medical support as well. As always, we want to partner with you in keeping your daughters emotionally healthy and academically successful.

# Friendly reminders from our Counseling Dept.

Senior parents/guardians:

Many scholarships are still available for Seniors. In classroom counseling groups students were shown how to access scholarship resources on their grade level Google classrooms. As Counseling receives scholarship information, we post it on a live Google doc titled "Upcoming Scholarship Opportunities," so that students can review the list of scholarships and information/links offered by companies, agencies, etc. Please encourage your student to visit her Google classroom for updates and to also use popular scholarship search engines, such as Going Merry, Fastweb, etc. in their search. Links for numerous scholarship search engines are also listed on the Google classroom. Remember: "You have to be in it, to win it."

#### Junior parents/guardians:

Mrs. Tortorella has shown students how to register for the SAT via their personal College Board accounts in their classroom counseling groups. Students and families

should begin reviewing the upcoming SAT dates to decide which is best for your student. Links to College Board and upcoming Digital SAT Dates and Deadlines and more information can be found on your student's grade level Google classroom counseling in the classwork section.

The cost of the SAT is \$60 unless your student qualifies for a fee waiver, in which case they are entitled to two free tests. Please review the SAT Fee Waiver **Eligibility** from College Board to see if your student qualifies for the fee waiver. If they do qualify, please have your student provide Murphy Mrs. with the appropriate documentation (snap letter, a student's SSI letter, or first two pages of your most recently filed 1040 tax forms) to confirm eligibility. Once a student's eligibility is verified, Mrs.Tortorella will provide the student with a fee waiver code to use at the time of registration. This information can also be found on the grade level counseling Google classroom.

## If you have questions about attendance or behavior policies during exams, please refer to the following, found in the Student Handbook:

p. 11 states that students MUST be in attendance for school and Regents examinations. There are no make-ups for Regents exams as they may only be administered when the state schedules them. (June, August, and January)

p. 11 & 17: "The one exception to the closed campus policy occurs during examinations in January and June. Students may leave the campus after they complete their exams. If the student is scheduled for both a morning and afternoon exam on the same day, she may leave the campus for lunch, <u>but may not travel by car unless driven by a parent or parent-designate</u>. *If a student leaves campus after her morning exam and returns late for her afternoon exam, she loses the portion of the exam time missed by her tardiness and she loses the "off-campus" privilege for the remainder of the exam period.* 

p. 12: See # 2 regarding the consequences for cheating on an exam.

In preparation for the National Honor Society Induction: Qualifications for membership in the Monsignor Thomas Preston Chapter of the National Honor Society will be posted around the school at the start of the third quarter. Academically eligible sophomores & juniors must submit their application materials detailing their leadership and service experiences by March 4<sup>th</sup>. All faculty members are asked for input on those eligible students whom they know well. The NHS Faculty Council *w*ill meet to determine membership. Students will be notified by letter of their selection for membership. Induction into the Chapter will be held on April 11<sup>th</sup>.
