Note from Lynsey Tortorella, Director of Counseling,

To Senior Parents/Guardians:

All seniors with a January application deadline or who want materials sent to schools before Christmas break should submit their Counselor Review Forms by Friday, December 1st. Once your student has applied to college, please encourage them to check their email accounts for directions from individual schools to create online portal accounts and to check their application and financial aid status.

We hope that most seniors were able to take advantage of amazing opportunities from SUNY and CUNY schools to waive their application fee at the end of October. Students who did not participate are still eligible to apply to these institutions by their application deadlines, but will now have to pay. The CUNY application is \$65 for 6 campuses and each SUNY campus application is \$50. Our experience from previous years has shown the CUNY application system becomes backlogged, causing a delay in students receiving their decision letters until March and even April due to processing delays.

Please remember that the exact date of the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) opening has yet to be released. All we know is that it is supposed to open sometime in December. However please keep in mind that the CSS profile became available October 1, 2023. We have reminded seniors to please check the colleges' websites for their individual, and often strict, priority filing deadline for the CSS profile (only certain private schools accept the CSS profile). Links for these websites and other financial aid resources can be

found on the senior Counseling Google Classroom. For a list of colleges that accept the CSS profile, please visit <u>CSS Profile</u>.

Reminder that if your student has not already done so, please encourage them to take advantage of our upcoming instant decision days. Students can sign up by completing the form on the counseling google classroom, please see the dates listed below for the participating colleges/universities:

Pace University on November 21st University of New Haven on November 30th St John's University December 11th Quinnipiac University on January 8th

We have already hosted instant decisions days for Dominican University and Iona University. Please note students who participate in instant decision days can receive scholarships which are only merit based. To receive other aid they must complete the FAFSA, TAP and still be reviewing the scholarship opportunities document located on google classroom and college websites for college specific scholarship.

To Junior and Senior Parents/Guardians:

Please review the accompanying <u>SAT Fee Waiver Eligibility</u> link to see if your student may be eligible for fee waivers when they register to take the SAT, AP exams, dual credit courses, college applications, etc. If you fit the eligibility criteria, you must submit one of the following documents to Mrs. Murphy for approval:

*Snap letter

*Confirmation of Student's SSI letter

*First two pages of your most recent filed 1040 tax forms

Once Mrs. Murphy verifies your eligibility, your student's counselor can then provide a fee waiver code or signature as needed when students register to apply for various tests and programs. Students need the fee waiver code BEFORE they register for their SAT through their College Board accounts.

To Freshman, Sophomore and Junior Parents/Guardians:

All students who took the October 2023 PSAT should have access to their scores online through their personal College Board account, starting November 16th. Students will receive instruction in their classroom counseling groups on how to access their PSAT scores and how to link their College Board accounts with Khan Academy to get free personalized SAT test prep. Juniors will also have instruction on how to register for the SAT if they have not already done so on their own.
