(Please note that students will be dismissed that day at 2:30 and that there will be a 1/2 hour dinner break at 5PM for the faculty.) # **College Information Instant Decision Days at Preston**

#### What Is Instant Decision Day?

- **Instant Decision Days allow you to** meet with admissions representatives, review your application, and **receive an instant application decision.**
- Applicants will meet with the admission representatives one-on-one for 10-15 minutes to review their transcripts, letters of recommendation, essay(s), and applications.
- This is a non-binding commitment and a wonderful opportunity! Fee Waivers are provided for all students who wish to participate in Instant Decision Days.
- All students who meet the requirements are encouraged to apply. Please look out for each College/University requirement and Complete the Google Form for each school once an announcement has been made.

We are happy to announce SUNY & CUNY institutions are again offering free applications for students later this month. We encourage all seniors to take advantage of these free applications. Please take the time to research the various campuses and programs of study by working with your senior to create a safety, target and reach list of schools for both <u>CUNY</u> and <u>SUNY</u>. We have found this <u>guide</u> to be helpful when breaking down a college list to determine students safety, target and reach schools.

On **October 22nd and 24th** the Counseling Department will be assisting seniors with their SUNY and CUNY applications. We will provide step by step guidance and a breakdown of how to apply. This information will also be shared on their Counseling Google Classroom for review. More detailed information about both free application opportunities and other resources are listed below.

#### **CUNY (City Colleges of New York):**

Seniors can apply to CUNY for FREE beginning **November 4th-November 15th**. NO FEE WAIVER CODE IS NEEDED. CUNY advises the students to apply to 6 campuses, 1 campus being a community college. The CUNY Application – The City University of New York

#### **SUNY (State Colleges of New York):**

Beginning **Monday, October 21st,** and ending **Sunday, November 3rd** students can apply to up to <u>five</u> SUNY campuses with no application fee! This includes all 64 SUNY campuses, no matter if the student is applying via Common Application or the SUNY Application. Click the link <u>here</u> for more information.

#### Senior Reminders:

Students must submit a Counselor Review Form 10 school days before the institution's deadline. Students are responsible for turning in a Counselor Review Form for each of the SUNY campuses you apply to. When applying to CUNY keep in mind you will only need to hand to your counselor one Counselor Review Form, with the 6 campuses listed and your CUNYFirst ID which will be sent to you directly via email (after you apply in class).

#### Scholarships:

For the Juniors, this is their first official college admission test, which results in students receiving informational literature from prospective colleges. It also serves as the qualifying exam for the National Merit Scholarship program. For the Freshmen, Sophomores and Freshmen who take it, this is a trial run, but since the feedback is very helpful, it is in their best interests to take the exam seriously.
