

Wishing you a restful and enjoyable summer ahead.



#### **OFFICE OF ACADEMICS**

Plato believed education was an arduous, but exciting, process of ascending out of a dark cave of ignorance and into the fresh bright light of the sun. Our students and teachers have climbed diligently all year, and they saw the benefits of that this Spring.



In April we hosted a validation visiting team from the Middle States Association, and they recommended us for reaccreditation. In May, 72 of our upper-class women took 100 AP exams, and 75 took dual enrollment courses through SUNY Albany and 41 through St. John's University for a total of 393 college credits. On May 21st, 158 students were honored at our Honors Convocation, and selected Juniors were awarded college scholarships: Le Moyne College Heights Award, Utica University-Junior Achievement Scholarship, The Rensselaer Medal at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, The Student Sage Award at Russell Sage College, Elmira College's T Key Award, and Saint Michael's College Book Award for Academic Achievement & Social Conscience.

We are very proud of our 83 graduates of the class of 2024 who earned over \$25 million in scholarships and grants! Of those 83 graduates, three students were \$1 million dollar scholars, another three students were accepted into the Sophie Davis School of Biomedical Education, and one was selected for the Simons STEM Scholars program at SUNY Stony Brook.

Once we have escaped the cave and achieved Truth, according to Plato, we must go back into the cave to help others on their journey out. We are excited that our graduates will spelunk anew in their colleges, and wherever their adventures take them!

Senior Danielle DeMattia won the Programma Ponte Scholarship to study abroad in Pisa, Italy this summer for two weeks. She will be taking classes




and attending cultural events while continuing to learn the language and further her studies. Danielle will be the only student attending from a Catholic high

# PRESTON SCHOLARS' Adventure in the Azores!

Thanks to another generous donation of \$100,000 to the Preston Scholars Program from a 1974 alumna, Ms. Eugenia Wolovich '10 and 11 students from the program traveled with EF Tours to the Azores, an archipelago of volcanic islands belonging to Portugal, this summer. The Azores are known for their volcanic origins and dramatic landscapes. This trip focused around just that!

To learn more about volcanic activity, students gained an understanding of the islands' origins with professors of Geology at the sismovolcanologic center to visits at the Gruta do Carvao, the longest lava tunnels on the main island of Sao Miguel. Students also collected water samples at the University of the Azores to study phytoplankton and their purpose in our ecosystems. To students' delight, they also went whale watching with local guides and were able to witness five different species of fish (from sperm whales to bottlenose dolphins) who are integral to the island's environment.

Whether it was coastline walks to discover geological patterns or dips in natural, thermal pools, students thoroughly enjoyed their opportunity to learn, gain a cultural understanding of a new place, and form tighter bonds with their classmates. These PSP trips have been instrumental in broadening our students' worldviews and their educational horizons.


