## Message From Our Principal



Dear Alumnae,

There is so much to be thankful for and so much to celebrate at PHS right now. On Saturday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>, we graduated 98 seniors, while also honoring Amanda Tamburrino, the senior we lost this September to cancer. It was a beautiful day on our back porch, with the view of the water, the graduates all in white seated under the shade of the Ginkgo tree, surrounded by their loved ones. It's such a lovely tradition and a link between the classes of the past and the present. Prior to graduation we celebrated the Baccalaureate Mass at St. Frances de Chantal Church and the seniors had their prom at Mulino's at Lake Isle Country Club.

The celebrations aren't just for the Seniors. On Tuesday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> we held our Academic Honors Convocation and honored 163 students for their hard work and dedication in their classes, evidenced by their grades. The Friday before that we held our Leadership Assembly, honoring all of the student leaders in the building, who run our clubs and honor societies, and at the end of April we held Sports Night and recognized our athletes.

This has been an exciting year for me and for the school, as we have expanded some of our offerings and formed new partnerships. We became the first high school in the ADNY to partner with Fearless+, a non-profit described as LinkedIn meets TikTok meets Master Class, which will enable our students to build an online portfolio for college recruiting purposes, take free classes and workshops to learn soft skills, and gain access to internships and networking.

Thanks to a generous alum donor, the Preston Scholars Program has been able to fund amazing opportunities for some of the members. This summer we have students and faculty attending seminars in Japan on Robotics, Germany on sustainability, and Great Britain on STEM.

At the end of March, Mrs. Fragale and I took a trip to the NYSE where some of our Juniors and Seniors participated in a financial literacy workshop specifically aimed at young women, and one of the students was selected to stand on the podium for the closing bell ceremony. We are in the process of working with yet another alum to bring Rock the Street to Preston- a program to encourage more women to go into Finance, which would bring female mentors to Preston, and allow our students to visit their firms in Manhattan. Students have participated in Engineering Tomorrow workshops, visited the Bronx Supreme Court, attended a Color of Justice event at Monroe College, and others are participating in the Billion Oyster Project at SUNY Maritime.

Post pandemic we have seen an increase in mental health issues, so we have started a mental health initiative this year- sharing resources with parents and students, running social-emotional learning homerooms, and hosting mental wellness homerooms with a certified instructor in the Winter and Spring. Beginning next year, we are partnering with JED, a mental health and suicide prevention program specifically for young people.

We are enjoying the lull in activity and looking forward to a successful 2023-2024 school year! Thank you for your support, and enjoy your summer!





Janelle Murray, a 10<sup>th</sup>-grader at Preston High School, was a Delegate to the Congress of Future Medical Leaders held on June 21-23, 2023, just outside Boston,

on the University of Massachusetts Lowell campus. The Congress is an honors-only program for high school students who want to become physicians or go into medical research fields. The purpose of this event is to honor, inspire, motivate and direct the top students in the country interested in those careers, to stay true to their dream and, after the event, to provide a path, plan and resources to help them reach their goal. Janelle's nomination was signed by Dr. Mario Capecchi, winner of the Nobel Prize in Medicine and the Science Director of the National Academy of Future Physicians and Medical Scientists to represent New York based on her academic achievement, leadership potential and determination to serve humanity in the field of medicine.

During the three-day Congress, Janelle Murray joined students from across the country and heard Nobel Laureates and National Medal of Science recipients discuss leading medical research; was given advice from Ivy League and top medical school deans on what to expect in medical school; witnesses stories told by patients who are living medical miracles; was inspired by fellow teen medical science prodigies; and learned about cutting-edge advances and the future in medicine and medical technology. At Preston, Janelle is involved in the Leaders of Color club and played the role of Vanessa in the Preston Players' production of *In the Heights*.

## JAMIE SKRAPITS, *Athletic Director*

My love for Preston started many years ago, 1969 to be exact when I was applying to high schools. I was so excited to join Preston's Class of 1973 to be a member of the athletics program. Unfortunately, my mom wrote the wrong TACHS code next to Preston on the application and they were not accepting any more incoming students so I went to St. Raymond's Academy for Girls. I finally got a chance to be part of the Preston community when my oldest daughter Melissa came in as a freshman in 1994, followed by Kelly in 1999. I remember asking Dr. Peggy Morton, Athletic Director at the time, if I could be more involved in the sports program. She proceeded to hand me all the team uniforms to wash. Laundry wasn't exactly what I had in mind but it was a start. When the Athletic Director position opened several years later, I asked Sr. Lucille if she thought I could do the job and her reply was so encouraging that I took the position 17 years ago and never looked back. Sr. Betty Ann would tell everyone that my spirit was always here and I truly believe that.

I cherish so many memories from my years at Preston, but the athletes are at the top. Every year at Sports Night, I tell the graduating athletes they each take a piece of my heart as they leave. I love when alum athletes keep in touch with calls and texts, but especially when they come "back home" to games and events. When they greet me with a hug and share stories of their lives now, I know I've done my job and I feel honored to have been a part of so many lives.

I have had a few accomplishments that really stick out in my mind. In my early years, administration had a strict rule that an athlete failing 2 subjects while in season would be removed from the team for that year. My philosophy however, is that without an incentive to study, an athlete won't feel motivated to better their grades. I advocated for a new rule: Any student failing 2 subjects while in season is suspended from games until passing. This model has been working since approved and student athletes continue to excel in their studies.

My greatest success story is a softball player whose grades were suffering. Her and I changed that by meeting with teachers, extra assignments, and making sure everything was turned in on time. We studied on the bus going and coming from games. She did her homework at my kitchen counter while I cooked dinner. She passed all her classes and played softball for Preston all 4 years. She went on to play in college and her coach would call whenever she slacked off. All she needed was a few words of encouragement from time to time. I hope she knows how proud I am of her for working as hard as she did, getting her degree and getting to play the sport that she loved.

Another Preston athlete went on to Scranton University and nominated me for being the most influential person at her high school. I was honored to stand next to and receive the Rose Kelly Award. Our bond did not end there. Upon finding out that I was diagnosed with breast cancer, she asked me to make a list of things that she could do to make my life easier. That was a difficult time in my life, but I had her and the Preston community by my side to help me through it. Who could be more blessed?

When I first started this position, Sr. Lucille said, "You are only as good as the people around you." I'm so blessed to have the most dedicated and hard-working coaches you could ask for and an administration team that supports us all. The sports program is thriving, athletes are working hard and happy to be on the field or the court. I remember all the athletes that have passed through Preston's doors. As we say, "Once a panther, always a panther" and I've been trying to find a way to bring them "back home". I'd like to start an Athletic Alumnae Association with an alumnae vs. students game for each sport, followed by a reception to reminisce and laugh about the good times. 
