
We continue to rely on the generosity of our alumnae and friends to help us meet the challenges of today. We are very grateful for your support!




ALUMNA Spotlight

MAURA CUNNINGHAM '76

Maura Cunningham is the Founder and CEO of Rock The Street, Wall Street, (RTSWS).

Rock The Street, Wall Street is a financial and investment literacy program designed to bring both gender and racial equity to the financial markets and spark the interest of high school girls into careers of finance.

Maura combined her entrepreneurial skills and her passion for propelling the next generation of financiers to include more women, to found Rock The Street, Wall Street in 2012. RTSWS sparks girls' enthusiasm for finance at a critical age to guide and demonstrate the societal benefits personal financial knowledge and math-oriented careers can have.



Maura has been committed to working with under-served girls for over a decade. She is helping girls view mathfocused fields of study as compatible with a career that has a positive impact on the world.

After graduating from Preston, Maura attended Pace University and received a BBA in Economics. She then began her career on Wall Street with Merrill Lynch. After a successful 25 year career in finance, she pursued her MA in Civic Leadership from Lipscomb University in 2012, with her thesis on "How We Lose Girls in Math as Early as Age Nine." Armed with the research and her own work experience in finance, she set forth to change the ratio of women who are in key roles in the financial services industry as well as bring more women to understand what it is to have an "investor identity" so they too, could build wealth by participating in the capital markets.

A few of Maura's fond memories of her time at Preston are:

"All the fun we had on the back porch and backyard just to chill and hang with our classmates and friends; science lab with Sr. Gertrude; Sr. Veronica's youthful demeanor; Layla by Derek and the Dominoes playing on the cafeteria juke box over and over and over. It brings me back to my teenage self each time I hear it today."

In her free time, Maura enjoys hiking, biking, golfing, pickleball and kayaking. Maura is married to James Fenton and has lived in Nashville for the past 20 years. Her daughter, Kaitlin, is an attorney for Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County.

ILZE KING:

Ilze King began working at Preston in September of 2005. She was hired by Maria Ronconi who was the Theology department chair at that time. Ilze remembers Ms. Ronconi as a caring, supportive and generous mentor who's presence and wisdom inspired and enriched her to learn all the necessary aspects of teaching. Ilze fell in love with teaching while working with the students at Preston. She has long gained inspiration from their eagerness to learn and willingness to take those first steps in journeying towards their life goals and dreams.

Ilze has taught every grade level and every Theology class offered by Preston but one class that has stayed constant is the Foundations in Catholic Morality. She loves guiding her students in becoming more consciously aware of themselves as divine images of God, and how that awareness-or unawareness- impacts the decisions they make along their journey. Her religious and educational goals remain the same: guiding her students in becoming young women of informed moral character, who are positively connected to themselves spiritually and emotionally, to their community and our beautiful but wounded planet.

Ilze is also dedicated to helping students explore their inner world of emotions, dreams and phobias and how it can become another path to religious and spiritual wholeness through teaching the Psychology and Faith course. A full year/experiential elective exposing students to the different psychological views of personality and development, Psych & Faith explores how the psychological shapes and informs the quality of one's faith relationship to God, self, and others.

Ilze continuously challenges herself to step out of her comfort zone, both personally and professionally. Her introverted nature sometimes challenges her to be fully engaged with large groups and being the center of attention. Her long and varied experiences at Preston have helped her learn and grow in this respect. Having finished her doctoral studies in 2010, she still resists being called Dr. King, preferring Mrs. King. Her studies have both supported and enriched her taking the lead in all the aspects of campus ministry, like organizing communal prayers, retreats, preparing for masses, and, when needed as a spiritual counselor. Ilze has also enjoyed being a moderator of Asian club helping and supporting students to take the roles of leadership and service while also having fun.

In her free time she enjoys spending time with her family, her husband Mark and two boys David (17) and Jason (12). They love spending time in nature going on hikes, boat rides and taking camping trips especially to the Thousand Islands region. Ilze enjoys creating things; since the pandemic she has gained great spiritual and emotional satisfaction working in her expanded garden and her growing number of animals that include her chickens, dogs, rabbits, gerbils, and any other sort of God's creatures that wonder by her home in Danbury, CT. 
